
Response Rate

- 224 responses out of 539 members* 42% response rate
- 11 (5%) were Associate members (living outside the area)
- 213 responses were from Full members out of 474 members 45% response rate




Q2. Do you support making permanent the current ETO (All Respondents)






Q2. Do you support making permanent the current ETO (Full Members only)







Q2. Do you support making permanent the current ETO by Area of Respondent






Q2. Do you support making permanent the current ETO by Area of Respondent (Full Members only)








Q3. If you answered Not sure, what would you prefer? (All Respondents)


Q3. If you answered Not sure, what would you prefer? (Full Members only)

- Satisfactory response rate given the response time
- QPARA membership remains divided with respect to the ETO
- A large majority want QPARA to continue its role on traffic
- These findings underline the importance of representing the full range of member views in our response to Brent

- Noting that road safety, traffic congestion and air pollution issues have been high on its agenda for many years, QPARA at its monthly meeting on 9th October 2025 resolves:
- To send Brent Council the full results of its survey of all 528 members held 2nd-8th
 October on the future of the Queen's Park Experimental Traffic Order which came into
 force on 8th May;
- Urges the Council to examine the results of its survey most carefully and;
- Strongly encourages it to engage actively with QPARA, neighbouring associations and the wider public on any further surveys and analysis with a view to finding a way forward which commands broad assent and will provide stability.
